

Signs Prohibited in All Districts

Violators receive a written warning to remove a sign in ten working days. If the sign is not removed, the owner may be assessed a fine and the sign removed by Public Works. More information, go to <http://www.hawaiicounty.gov/lb-countycode/#countycode> .

- Any sign in the county right-of-way or on county property
- Signs by reason of size, location, movement, content, coloring, etc, that pose a traffic safety hazard
- Any sign which is obscene
- Any sign that advertises a commercial activity not conducted on the premises
- Temporary signs used for ongoing commercial use
- Automated signs
- Aerial signs
- Any sign placed on a utility pole
- Portable signs
- Flashing signs
- Any sign placed on a tree
- Any sign placed on public property unless otherwise authorized
- Any sign that is a billboard or outdoor advertising device prohibited by chapter 445 of the Hawai'i Revised Statutes
